To Whom It May Concern,

The Consumer Product Safety Improvement Act of 2008 (“Act”) requires that General Conformity Certificates (“Certificates”) must be issued for products subject to a consumer product safety rule that are manufactured on or after November 12, 2008. In accordance with the Act, we have been issuing Certificates for children’s products manufactured on or after November 12, 2008 confirming that we satisfy the CPSC regulations applicable to our children’s products (including the then-applicable lead limitations); the Certificates contain a certification as to the applicable lead limits based on the date of importation; however, in fact no product in the applicable PO have lead limits above 100 ppm for substrates and 90 ppm for surface coating. Additionally, no products in the applicable PO manufactured after August 14, 2011 have lead limits above 90 ppm for substrates.

Additionally, as required by the Act, all Under Armour products meet the relevant requirements for small parts, sharp points/edges, flammability, and drawstrings. The Certificates accompany the shipments of all our products in accordance with the Act. However, the Certificates and the actual test result reports are not provided with the shipments to retailers or wholesalers but will be kept on file at Under Armour, Inc. headquarters in Baltimore, Maryland or at Under Armour’s footwear manufacturers’ headquarters in the event that you, the CPSC, or other government agent requests to see them.
