As a socially responsible supplier of wearable apparel products we are further committed to meeting all requirements outlined in the newly enacted consumer product legislation.

We have been testing our products for many years, and confirm that all products we sell meet current federal requirements. Our products undergo specific testing related to flammability, small parts, phthalates and lead content. We are compliant with the Flammable Fabrics Act, Federal Hazardous Substances Act, the Consumer Product Safety Act and Consumer Product Safety Improvements Act ("CPSIA").

The CPSIA regulates all consumer products, from tamper proof medicine bottles and gas cans to age appropriate toy ratings. Basically, everything we as consumers purchase. The CPSIA introduced new requirements for all consumer products, including wearable textiles. These updates may affect some of the products you purchase from Skins Game Clothing.

The CPSIA took effect on February 10, 2010 (except for a limited range of children's products and for certification on lead content which goes into effect on

February 10, 2011), and is applicable to products manufactured on and after February 10, 2010. These requirements are related to hazardous substances, flammability, lead content limits and the absence of certain banned phthalates. As part of our corporate citizenship program we have been, and will continue, obtaining the required testing, including approved third party testing laboratory testing, where appropriate, for all of these items.
