To Whom It May Concern,

The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, better known by Proposition 65 requires the State of California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer or birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

Businesses are required to provide a "clear and reasonable" warning before knowingly and intentionally exposing anyone to a listed chemical. This warning enables Californians to make informed decisions about protecting themselves from exposure to these chemicals. By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm. These "safe harbor" levels are established for some but not all listed chemicals.

All Under Armour products are evaluated for the potential to contain a Prop 65 listed chemical based on known information regarding its use, without attempting to evaluate the level of exposure. A warning label is provided on any product which is identified as containing one or more listed chemical. Under Armour also has a Restricted Substances (RS) Program which requires all applicable components on all products to be tested for lead and phthalates.
