Threadfast shall provide, upon request, a General Certificate of Conformity (GCC), and Children's Product Certificate (CPC) for any product that is subject to any safety rule, ban, standard, and regulation. Please be advised that any certifications we provide are for the finished, blank products we produce. If any of our blank products is later altered or treated, in any way, by a third party, our testing and certifications will not apply to the decoration or additional treatments added to the garment.

Threadfast continues to monitor CPSIA developments and shall make all necessary adjustments to our program, in order to comply with all CPSC rules.
